The Global Engagement Master's Partnership Pathway (GEMPP) Programmes offer students the best way to prepare for their world class UCD master's degree through a combination of academic, language, cultural and study skills modules.

PROGRAMME SUMMARY

The GEMPP Programmes offer the flexibility of a one trimester programme starting in January (3+0.5+1) or a two trimester (3+1+1) programme beginning in September. Students will attend English for Academic Purposes classes and modules relevant to their academic subject area. Students will also have the opportunity to take thesis preparation, cultural, and creative thinking modules while acclimatising to life in UCD before commencing their master's studies.

GEMPP students must meet the academic entry requirements of their chosen master's. GEMPP students achieving the progression requirements will automatically receive a full offer for their master's. Progression requirements to UCD master's programmes may vary. All necessary credits will be transferred to students' home universities after completing the programme.
